Important Notes:	It is important that students have enough funding to cover the
	expected costs of their stay at Keio, which should be at least
	¥130,000 (or equivalent in the student's currency) per month
	for the expected period of stay. It is very difficult for exchange
	students to apply for a scholarship after they come to Japan. It
	is also difficult for exchange students to get a part-time job.

Availability of university dormitories	Keio housing (accommodations subsidized by Keio) is
	GUARANTEED for exchange students if they apply for housing
	on time.
Rent (subject to change)	The rent charged to students varies from ¥ 51,000 to ¥78,000
	yen (approx. \$430 to \$650). Students will also be charged a
	one-time, additional maintenance fee of ¥20,000 for their first
	month's rent. Deposits and key money are not required.
Application procedures for housing	We will send housing information including the application
	procedures to students together with their acceptance letter.
Additional important information	No airport pick-up services are provided for students.
	Detailed directions will be given by e-mail after the student's
	dormitory is confirmed.
