#### **Course Description:**

This course investigates and raises questions as to the historic success of Jewish nationalism (Zionism) in establishing the State of Israel based on the ancient connection to the Land of Israel as promised in the Hebrew Scriptures or Old Testament (Tanakh).

Having established a state against all odds following the catastrophe of the Holocaust the Jewish nation state fought for its survival in three major wars and four single front conflicts. Since 1948 Israel has absorbed and continues to integrate over 2 million immigrants into its economy and society.

Once seen as very much a secular state, Israel has become more religious over the past generation especially as concerns the growth of the ultra-orthodox population and the national religious settlement movement. Nowadays multiple contradictions abound: Is the state Jewish, democratic or both? Is the state for all citizens or for the Jewish People worldwide? Secular or religious? And what of the minority Arabic speaking population?

Security remains a major issue: Could the rising Jihadi activity led by Hamas, Hezbollah, Iran and others on its borders be the ultimate challenge even for the Israeli army?

We will review possible conflict resolution with the Palestinians beginning with the Oslo Accords. Yet a "two-state solution" with Israel living alongside a Palestinian State leads to virtually insurmountable security problems yet a "one-state solution" means a bi-national state and quite possibly an end to Jewish independence. With close to half a million Jews living in the West Bank in the Palestinian territories are any peace initiatives even feasible?





In short, will Israel survive as a Jewish and democratic state achieving peace and security with its neighbors? In our class we will examine and attempt to answer these fundamental questions.
