INTERNATIONAL UNDERGRADUATE RESEARCH OPPORTUNITIES PROGRAM (iUROP)

iUROP provides the opportunity for exchange students to work together with SUTD faculty and students on cutting edge and innovative research projects during their exchange.

Students will be able to participate in the different phases of research activity which include, developing research plans, writing proposals, conducting research, analysing data and presenting research results in oral and written form.

Besides immersing in SUTD's rich research culture, students also get the chance to gain multicultural and interdisciplinarv design perspectives.

On average, students will commit no more than 12 hours per week. The exact number of hours depends on the project nature, students' progress and own time management, as well as students' arrangement with project supervisor.

Exchange students can opt for iUROP Lite or iUROP Mezzo. iUROP application will be sent to interested students after they have received the exchange offer from SUTD.

iUROP Lite	Non- credit Bearing	Upon successful completion, your supervisor will recommend whether an iUROP certificate of participation will be awarded to you.
iUROP Mezzo	Credit Bearing (12 credits)	Upon successful completion with a Pass grade, you will be awarded 12 credits which will be counted towards your total subject credits. Do note that the maximum subject credits you can take in SUTD during your term of exchange is 48 subject credits.

CREDIT SYSTEM

1 SUTD Subject Credit (SCs) is equivalent to 1 hour of workload per week. The subject workload in terms of hours and SCs is represented by a series of 3 numbers. All of the 3 numbers add together to represent the total SCs for the subject.

For example: 3-5-4 (Total SCs is 12)

(3)

First number represents actual contact hours for lectures or cohort-based learning per week

Second number represents hours for laboratory, design or fieldwork per week

Third number refers to hours a student is expected to spend on preparation per week

GRADING SYSTEM

SUTD uses a 5-point grading system as follows:

Grade	Point	Remarks
A	5	Excellent performance demonstrating a superior understanding of the subject matter.
В	4	Good performance and good understanding of the subject matter.
С	3	Satisfactory performance and adequate understanding of the subject matter.
D	2	Minimally acceptable performance demonstrating some familiarity with the subject matter. Typically considered as the passing grade.
F	0	Failed

SUTD STUDENT INSURANCE

During your stay in SUTD (from Matriculation Day to end of Term), you will be covered by the SUTD Student Insurance Scheme (policy under AXA).

Please refer to mycg.com.sg/sutd (recommended to use Google Chrome for optimised viewing) for more details on insurance coverage, the list of AXA Panel GP Clinics you can visit if you feel unwell, and the procedures you need to complete if you require hospitalisation.

You would need to make your own arrangement for travel insurance coverage should you intend to arrive in Singapore earlier than the Matriculation Day or extend your stay in Singapore beyond the end of Term.



Students nominated by SUTD's partner universities are eligible to enjoy tuition fee waivers for exchanges at SUTD.

Students need to ensure that they are capable of going through an academic term with subjects delivered in English.

SUBJECT CREDITS

Exchange students are required to take a minimum of 24 subject credits (in order to be issued with a Student Pass in Singapore) or a maximum of 48 subject credits in SUTD during your term of exchange.



OTHOST PILLAR

Exchange students are required to choose a Host Pillar, with **at least 50%** of their total subject credits from their Host Pillar of choice.

As the allocation of subject(s) is subjected to availability and fulfilment of the subject(s)' pre-requisites, you may not be given your preferred choice of subjects to take during your exchange, hence you are required to select additional subjects in your order of preference during exchange application.

STUDENT PASS APPLICATION

STEP 1

Application through SOLAR system

All international students must hold a valid Student Pass issued by the Singapore Immigration & Checkpoints Authority (ICA) for their studies at SUTD. Generally, foreign students studying in SUTD are granted Student Pass for the full duration of the exchange period.

Application for Student Pass is to be made through the ICA Student's Pass On-Line Application & Registration (SOLAR) system. SUTD will inform you via email when the SOLAR system is open for application. You will need to login to SOLAR to complete the application, submit eForm16 and make payment of SGD30.00 for the non-refundable processing fee for Student Pass application

STEP 2

Issuance of In Principal Approval (IPA) Letter

At the end of your application, you should print out the electronic form eForm16 and bring it to Singapore, together with the In Principal Approval (IPA) Letter which will be emailed to you when your application is approved. For applicants who require a visa to enter Singapore, a visa will be incorporated in the IPA letter. Students need not apply for a separate visa and may enter Singapore by producing the IPA letter at the customs.



STEP 3

Making Appointment with ICA

Upon receipt of your IPA letter, you will be required to login to SOLAR system to make payment of SGD60.00 for issuance fee and SGD30.00 for multiple-journey visa (where applicable) and to make an appointment with ICA for completion of formalities for the issuance of your Student's Pass.



Student Pass Collection Upon Arrival in Singapore

Upon arrival in Singapore, you will need to report to ICA on your appointment date for completion of formalities for the issuance of your Student's Pass. More information will be provided in the SUTD Exchange Handbook emailed to you upon offer of exchange.

STEP 5

Cancellation / Returning of Student Pass

Foreign students are required to surrender their Student Passes for cancellation within 7 days from the date of cessation or termination of their study. SUTD will assist in the cancellation towards the end of your exchange and you will need to return your Student Pass to Office of International Relations. You will receive a cancellation letter to be presented to the Immigration Office at the customs when you leave Singapore. Once the Student Pass has been cancelled, you will need to apply for the relevant pass/visa if you wish to re-enter Singapore.
