What is the main language of instruction?	English
Do you offer courses in English?	All courses are in English, other than the foreign language courses.
Do you offer a pre-semester language course for exchange students? If yes, are there fees attached?	English languages courses are available at the UNSW Institute of Languages http://www.languages.unsw.edu.au/coursesMain.html They are offered throughout the year (both before and during semester) but students are required to pay a course fee and it is not included in to 24 units of credit students are required to complete at UNSW.

	A Language Exchange may also be available through Student Development International free of charge.
Is it possible for undergraduate exchange student to choose courses of graduate programs?	Generally no, but there are limited options for Law and some Science or Engineering subjects.
What is the standard full time load?	24 units of credit (usually four subjects)

Is there a website that contains a course list available to exchange students?	http://www.handbook.unsw.edu.au After selecting either under-grad or post-grad, students can search by program or course. They can also click on the name of the course to get a course description. This will also list pre-requisites for the course. http://www.timetable.unsw.edu.au/current/subjectSearch.html The timetable lists all course codes and course names. Students can check semester availability of courses based on the current academic year.
Are there any course restrictions for incoming students?	Students cannot take courses from the Faculty of Medicine. Courses beginning with these codes are restricted: GLST, INST, MDCM, MDIA, EDST, Zxxx, MARK6xxx, GBAT and JURD (though Juris Doctor students can take JURD courses). Also, online courses, PG psychology, dance and music courses and any courses that are part of an honours program are restricted.
Are there any other restrictions or requirements students should be aware of for your University Exchange Program? (e.g. 3rd year and above students only)	Students must meet pre-requisites for courses.
