How do students register for their courses?  <i>By using the Studentweb: <a href="http://www.uio.no/english/studies/registrations/">http://www.uio.no/english/studies/registrations/</a></i></li> <li>2. Can students pre-register for their courses?  <i>Yes. Students are provided with log-on details for Studentweb by SMS.</i></li> <li>3. What are registration deadlines?  <i>Students must register their courses within 1 February for courses in the Spring semester and 1 September for courses in the Autumn semester.</i></li> <li>4. How can students access course syllabus?  <i>The course descriptions also contain detailed descriptions:  <a href="http://www.uio.no/english/studies/courses/">http://www.uio.no/english/studies/courses/</a></i></li> <li>5. What is the minimum/maximum number of courses a student may register in?  <i>The regular full-time course load per semester is 30 ECTS. Most courses are 10 ECTS each so most students take three 10 credit courses</i></li> <li>6. If problems arise during their registration, who can students contact for help?  <i>Each faculty and department has an international coordinator who can help with these issues.</i></li> </ol>

<b>Visa Information</b>	<p><b>Students residing outside The European Economic Area</b> must apply for a visa and residence permit immediately after they have received their Letter of Admission from the University of Oslo.
