

Program Information

1) Semester in Washington Program follows Georgetown's undergraduate academic calendar so Spring semester runs from January 11 through May 12.

2) Admissions requirements are (also found on <http://scs.georgetown.edu/washington>):

- online application form and \$35 application fee
- one letter of recommendation (from a Professor or professional source)
- resume
- one/two page essay describing interest in the program, explaining background and education, career goals
- official transcripts in English
- evaluation of transcripts to the U.S. system either through World Education Service (www.wes.org) or Education Credentials Evaluators (www.ece.org)
- TOEFL (600 paper-based, 100 iBT) or IELTS (7.5 or higher)

3) We may offer a reduced tuition of \$12,000 per student. Housing and meals will run extra. Typically, it is about \$5,000 extra, depending on where the student is housed and what meal plan he/she selects.

5) Internships: once a student has been admitted to the program, the Internship Adviser works with the student on the internship placement, keeping in mind the student's education and career goals. For international students on a student visa most federal jobs might not be available but we have a number of other interesting opportunities in the private, non-profit and even public sector that may not require security clearance/background check.
