Mid-December	Mid-June	Once accepted, acceptance packages will be sent to the exchange coordinator by express mail.

Mid-February	Late July	Keio will send accepted students the Certificate of Eligibility.  With this certificate, students can apply for a student visa at the Japanese Embassy or consulate.

	yen (approx. \$500 to \$700). Students will also be charged a
	one-time, additional maintenance fee of ¥20,000 for their first
	month's rent. Deposits and key money are not required.

## LIVING EXPENSES

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Taking utilities, food, clothes, transportation, books and
miscellaneous expenses into consideration, monthly living
costs should come to about ¥130,000 - ¥170,000.
Keio Housing*: ¥55,000 - ¥78,400
Food: ¥30,000 - ¥60,000
Clothes: ¥10,000 - ¥20,000
Books: ¥7,000
Transportation: ¥8,000+
Medical Insurance: ¥1,500
Mobile Phone: ¥5,000+
Miscellaneous: ¥15,000
It is important that students have enough funding to cover the
expected costs of their stay at Keio, which should be at least
¥130,000 (or equivalent in their country's currency) per month
for the expected period of stay. It is very difficult for exchange
students to apply for a scholarship after they come to Japan.
It is also difficult for exchange students to get a part-time job.
