Step 1 - Nomination	is extremely competitive. A very limited number of students are accepted. Course flexibility is necessary.Exchange students must be officially nominated by their home university. Nominations should be sent by email to the responsible coordinator. We must receive nomination email before the students start their application.
Step 2 – Online application & Required documents	Application is done <u>entirely online</u> . Nominated students will receive application instructions by email. Information about the procedure can also be found <u>here</u> The following documents are required as part
	of the application: 1. Transcript of records (in English) 2. Letter of motivation All documents should be uploaded in the online application. No hardcopies are required.
Step 3 – Housing application	 Students should apply for housing <u>after</u> they have submitted their online application. Students will receive a unique housing application code ones submitted their online application. Deadline for housing application is the same as the online application. No late applications can be accepted. Information about the housing application can be found <u>here.</u>
Step 4 – Screening procedure	The application will be sent to relevant faculties/departments for screening and course approval.
Step 4 – Acceptance Letter	Acceptance letter will be issued upon course approval: Autumn semester/full year: no later than mid-June Spring semester: No later than the beginning of December. <i>Mid</i> <i>October for students who applied before October 1st and</i> <i>need the acceptance letter for visa application procedures.</i> Acceptance letter will only be sent as digital copies by email to the student and the International coordinator. No
	Acceptance letter will only be sent as digital copies by email to the student and the International coordinator. No original hardcopies will be sent since digital copy is enough for the visa application.

Course load	Normal workload (full time studies) for one semester is 30 credits. Courses usually consist of 7.5 credits, 15 credits, or 30 credits each.
