GENERAL INFORMATION

About SFU

Simon Fraser University was founded 50 years ago with a mission to be a different kind of university – to bring an interdisciplinary rigour to learning, to embrace bold initiatives, and to engage deeply with communities near and far.

Our vision is to be Canada's most community-engaged research university.

Today, SFU is Canada's leading comprehensive research university and is ranked one of the top universities in the world. With campuses in British Columbia's three largest cities – Vancouver, Burnaby and Surrey – SFU has eight faculties, delivers almost 150 programs to over 35,000 students, and boasts more than 130,000 alumni in 130 countries around the world.

Campus Locations

Simon Fraser University's three unique campuses, spread throughout Metropolitan Vancouver, are all within an hour of one another by public transit.

Burnaby (main campus): Perched atop Burnaby Mountain, Simon Fraser University's original Arthur Erickson-designed campus now includes more than three dozen academic buildings and is flanked by UniverCity, a flourishing sustainable residential community.

Surrey: A vibrant community hub located in the heart of one of Canada's fastest-growing cities.

Vancouver: Described by local media as the "intellectual heart of the city", SFU's Vancouver Campus transformed the landscape of urban education in downtown Vancouver. The campus is comprised of multiple facilities clustered in the core of Vancouver.

Metropolitan Vancouver

Transcripts

At the end of each student's exchange period, ISS will mail one copy of each student's official transcript directly to the partner institution's international office. ISS will provide students with instructions on how to order additional transcripts for personal use (students will need to pay a fee for ordering additional transcripts). ISS is unable to order/send students' transcripts until they have paid all outstanding fees to SFU.

GPA	SFU does not have a minimum GPA requirement for inbound exchange/study abroad students. We trust that our partners perform a rigorous internal selection process and honour nominations accordingly.

ACCOMMODATION INFORMATION

On-Campus

SFU's on-campus residence is located at the Burnaby Campus. It is 5-15 minutes walking distance to most buildings on the Burnaby Campus and approximately 45-60 minutes by public transportation to the Surrey and Vancouver campuses.

Places in residence are offered on a first-come-first-serve basis, so students are encouraged to apply early as below. We are not able to guarantee on-campus housing for exchange students.

Students should apply for housing *at the same time* they apply to SFU for their exchange/study abroad term. Students must pay a mandatory application fee in order to apply for on-campus housing.

NOTE: When asked for their SFU student number on the housing application, students should write "EXCHANGE" (unless they already have an SFU student number, which most will not).

Students must submit BOTH their "Exchange and Study Abroad" application (to ISS) and their "On-Campus Housing" application (to the Housing office) by the Exchange application deadline (March 31 or September 30) in order to be placed on a "priority housing list".

If they are offered a space in residence, students will need to pay a deposit to hold their place. This deposit is usually due prior to course enrollment having taken place. CHANGE: As of Fall 2018, students will need to pay their residence fees for the upcoming semester *before* the start of term (previously, students would pay their residence fees approximately 1 month *after* the start of the term). Full details and deadlines will be communicated to students directly from SFU Residence.
