6. Insurance

Health Insurance	Exchange students are required to register for the "National Health Insurance (Kokumin Kenko Hoken)" after arriving in Utsunomiya.
	Estimated insurance fee: approximately 2,000 yen per month.
Personal Accident Insurance for students Pursuing Education and Research (PAS)	All the students of Utsunomiya University are required to purchase the insurance called "PAS." PAS covers injuries in the event of unexpected accidents during lectures, research activities, school events and so forth.
	The insurance fee for a year is 1,340 yen.

7. Visa Information

Exchange students need to apply for a "student visa."

When applying for the visa, students need a "certificate of eligibility" issued by an immigration bureau in Japan. Documents necessary for obtaining this certificate are included in application documents so that we can apply for it on behalf of students.
