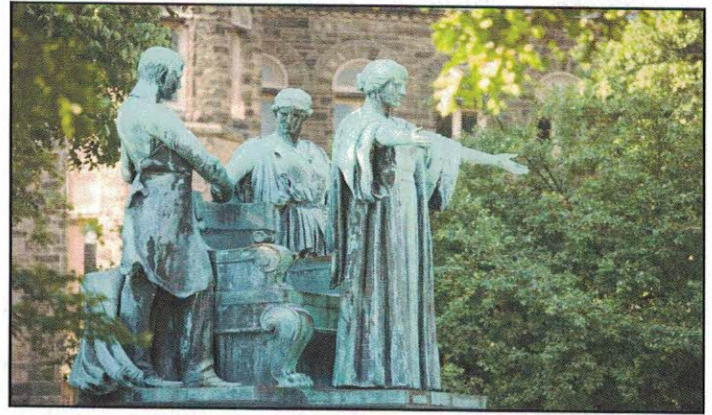

# The Courses

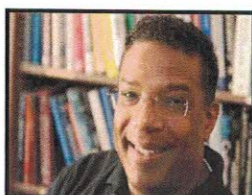


## Control Systems

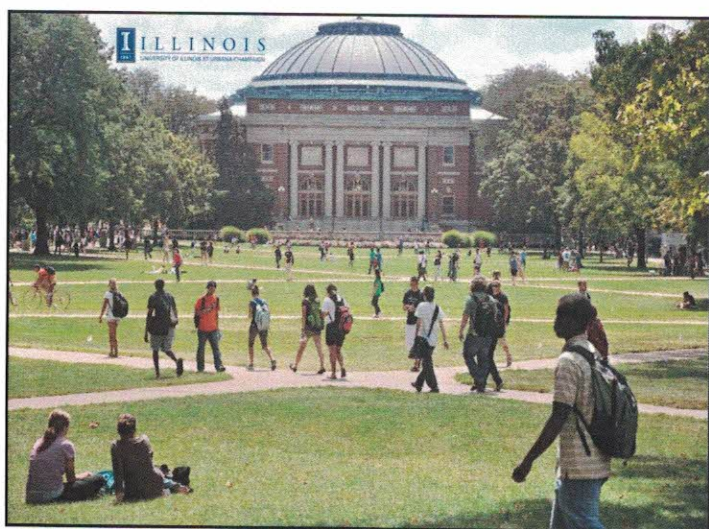

## Information Science & Strategy

This class addresses how to evaluate, select and manage information systems that will be used in the daily operation of information centers. It includes the systems used by technical staff and the information consumers. Course will focus on information as a product. Attention is given to the operation of an organization as a whole and the impact of change on the integration of resources, work flow and usability. Formal methods for modeling systems, and industry practice techniques of analysis are used to address these problems and opportunities.

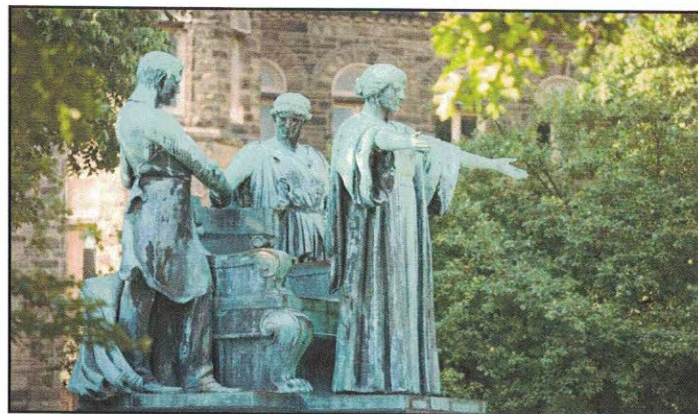

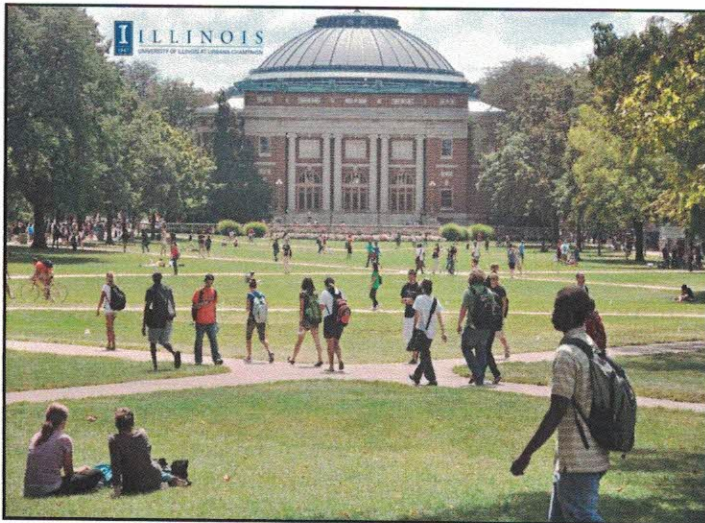

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# The Courses

## Development Economics

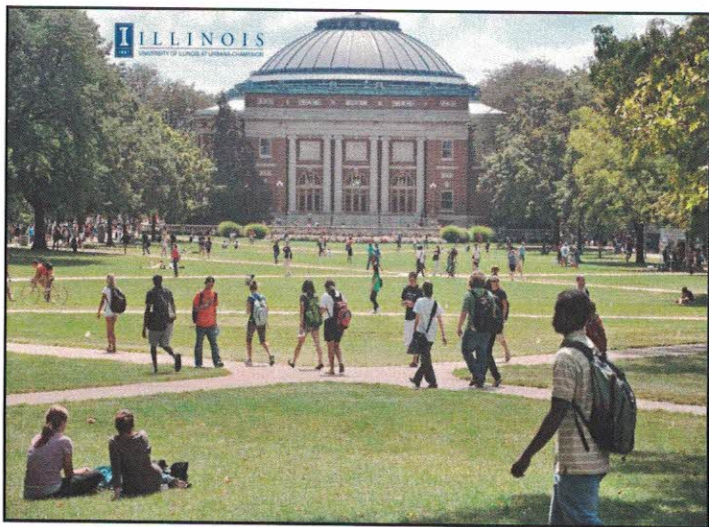
This course focuses on the application of economic reasoning and analysis to business decision-making. Topics may include demand and supply analysis, estimation of demand by firms, pricing and non-price competition in contested markets, game theoretic perspectives on business strategy, and other topics of interest.

## Money and Banking

This course will focus on the forces (information and transaction costs) that have propelled the historical evolution of money, credit, and financial intermediation from the ancient world to present. Related financial institutions such as bond, stock, and insurance markets are also explored. In addition, the course will cover the structure of the Federal Reserve System & bank regulation.

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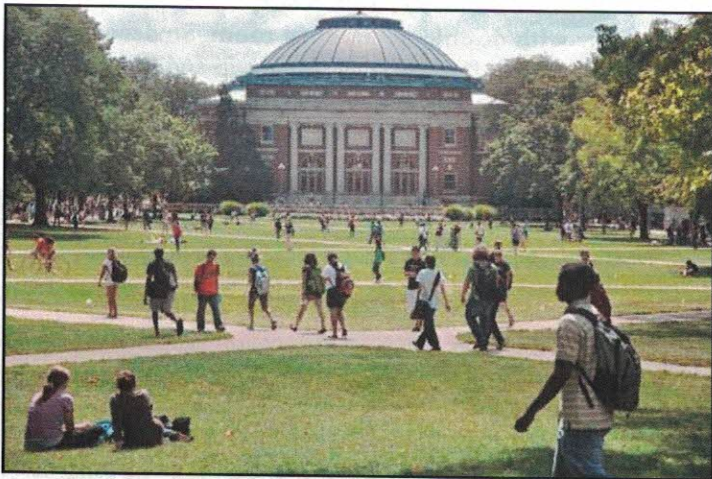

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# The Courses

## Financial Management



The financial management course is an examination of topics in general and corporate finance. Topics covered will include, but are not limited to, time value of money, asset valuation, risk and return, and risk management. We will examine valuation of equities, bonds, projects, and entire firms. Risk management topics will include commodity/financial futures and options.

## Accounting Theory – Special Topics



This course introduces students to the role of accounting information as a tool used by decision makers for resource allocation and as a tool used by the firm internally to coordinate and control its broader organizational units. Within a small business context, students will develop a deeper appreciation for the qualities of useful information, the business environment in which financial reporting decisions are made, and the risks which threaten the achievement of organizational objectives.

## Entrepreneurship



The goal of this course is to learn to use financial statements as tools to help manage a business, to learn some of the contemporary methods of financing small businesses, their attendant costs and benefits, to gain some understanding about the business environment and its effects on owner-managers of businesses, to gain an understanding of the problems of start-up ventures, and to learn different approaches to the valuation of businesses. The student is expected to assume the role and attitude of the owner-manager of a business.
