Nomination and Application Procedures		
Nomination period	Nomination of students is done online by the student's home university. Instructions are sent shortly before the nomination period. Autumn and academic year: 15 – 31 March Spring: 15 – 30 September	
Application period	Once the nominations have been submitted students receive an email with log in details that are required to apply online. Autumn semester: 1 – 25 April Spring semester: 1 – 25 October	
Supporting documents	 All supporting documents need to be uploaded in the application; no hard copies should to be sent to Lund University. Official Transcript of Records including the courses you are currently taking CV Statement of Purpose Portfolio required for studies in Industrial Design, Architecture, Arts and Music Swedish language certificate, level 3, is required if you intend to study in Swedish 	
Application and acceptance step by step	 Nomination completed by student's home university. E-mail with application log in details sent to student. Submit application including supporting documents. Apply for housing. Letter of Acceptance sent via e-mail to the student, along with the "Result of your application" showing the current status of course admission. Courses and Study Re	quirements
Course load	Exchange students are expected to study full-time, 30 credits/ semester. Lund University will not allow students who are already admitted to full time studies to overload.
Courses for exchange students	 700 courses suitable for exchange students are offered across a wide range of subjects. Find courses in English per Faculty: <u>www.lunduniversity.lu.se/exchange-courses</u> Special Area Studies in English: Scandinavian studies, European studies and Global issues (SAS) are specially designed for exchange students. <u>www.lunduniversity.lu.se/sas</u> Swedish Language Courses for exchange students (SVE): <u>www.lunduniversity.lu.se/exchange-swedish</u> (not available for Danish and Norwegian students)
Studying in Swedish	Students with a background in Scandinavian studies or who have studied in a Nordic school system may be able to apply for courses with Swedish as the language of instruction. Find courses: <u>http://www.lu.se/lubas/subjects</u> Please note that course websites stating "Kan bara sökas inom utbildningsprogram" are not available.
Language requirements	It is recommended that your level of English language proficiency is equivalent to IELTS 6.5/ TOEFL 90. The Swedish language requirement for exchange students wishing to study Swedish-taught courses is "Svenska 3" or equivalent.
Special requirements	 Prerequisites for each course can be found on the website of the relevant department. Many courses require at least 1 year of full-time studies within the subject area. School of Architecture and Dept. of Industrial Design require 3 years of prior studies in the subject. Read more about special department requirements: www.lunduniversity.lu.se/exchange-requirements
Restrictions and limitations	 Courses at Lund University School of Economics and Management (LUSEM) are very popular, therefore availability is limited. Add alternative courses from other faculties in your course selection to be able to get a full time course load. Faculty of Performing Arts, the Malmö Art Academy and the Faculty of Medicine mainly admit students within specific faculty/department agreements. Courses in Journalism are not available. Be mindful that not all courses given in English are open to exchange students.
