## PROGRAM OUTLOOK

### Hybrid Program

#### Morning sessions: *English for Communication*

Communications skills with focus on Speaking, Reading, Listening and Writing Practice. Students are in a class with a mix of nationalities.

Delivery mode: 20 hrs per week

Course completion certificate mapped to the CEFR (Common European Framework of Reference for Languages).

Accompanying teachers at no charge to audit classes.

### Optional afternoon sessions:

#### ○ *Global Leaders Program*

Example sessions on *Intercultural Competence for Leaders; Conflict resolution Skills; Global and International Marketing; Digital Entrepreneurship.*

Sessions delivered by CET Business English specialists and Sydney University lecturers.

You can choose from 4 to 10 hours per week.

#### ○ *Research Skills for Students*

Example sessions on *Using Online Databases; Reviewing Journal Papers; Structuring Essays; Referencing Systems and Software; Presentations Skills for Academia.*

Students conduct individual research projects with a written assessment and an academic presentation at the end.  
You can choose from 4 to 12 hours per week.

○ **Cultural Immersion**

Example sessions on *Australiana: an Introduction to Australian Culture*; *Australian Art*; *Discover Sydney's Hidden Stories*; *Indigenous Experience at the University of Sydney*.  
You can choose from 2 to 8 hours per week.

○ **Introduction to Academic Culture**

Example sessions on *Australian Academic Culture*; *Writing Literature Reviews*; *Presenting Research Findings*.

Students conduct individual research projects with a written assessment and an academic presentation at the end.  
You can choose from 4 to 12 hours per week

○ **Leadership for Women**

Example sessions on *Assertive Communication for Women*; *Cross-Cultural Competence for Leaders*; *Presentation Skills for Leaders*; *Strengths Assessment and Career Goal Setting*.

The program participants work on individual projects with a formal presentation at the end.  
You can choose from 4 to 10 hours per week.

○ **Deliver Effective Presentations**

Example sessions on *Presentation Structure and Signposting*; *the Body Language of Confident Speakers*; *Intonation and Pronunciation Patterns*; *Handling Questions and Answers Sessions*; *Managing Nerves and Presentation Anxiety*.

You can choose from 4 to 10 hours per week.

○ **Cultural Program with Sydney University Student Ambassadors**

Example sessions *University of Sydney Campus Tour*; *Interactive University Heroes Video activity* (students make their own short movie); *Goose Chase (Campus Treasure Hunt)*; *Chat Buddies* (tea conversation sessions); *Sydney City Walk Tours* with Ambassadors

You can choose from 4 to 10 hours per week.
