
International Summer Institute

Required Documents

- Medical Documents (only for on-campus housing applicants)
 SNU Health Form, Proof of Immunization for Measles, Proof of Noninfection for Tuberculosis
- Statement of Qualification (ony for scholarship applicants)

Visa

• Students are responsible for receiving an entry visa unless there is a visa waiver agreement between South Korea and their home countries.
