Note: After Add/Drop Period, all subjects are examinable. It is compulsory to sit for exams for all the subjects you take. Absence in exams may result in a "F" grade in your transcript.

C) SUTD Grading System

SUTD uses a 5-point grading system for both Undergraduate (level UG) and Graduate (level G) degree programmes. The following grade notations and status codes are used:

Grade	Point	Remarks
Α	5	Excellent performance demonstrating a superior understanding of the subject matter.
В	4	Good performance and good understanding of the subject matter.
С	3	Satisfactory performance and adequate understanding of the subject matter.
D	2	Minimally acceptable performance demonstrating some familiarity with the subject matter. However, students may not be adequately equipped to move on to more advanced subjects in the field without additional work.
F	0	Failed

Note: Beginning in Term 4 (Pillar Years), A to F grades will appear on the transcripts of students, with D considered as the passing grade.

D) Subject Credit System

- 1 SUTD Subject Credit (SC) is equivalent to 1 hour of workload per week.
- The subject workload in terms of hours and SCs is represented by a series of 3 numbers. All of the 3 numbers added together represent the total SCs for the subject.
- Example: Subject Credit 5-0-7
 - o The first number (5) represents the actual contact hours per week assigned for lectures/mini lectures and recitations/cohort-based learning.
 - The second number (0) represents the number of hours assigned to laboratory, design, or fieldwork per week.
 - The third number (7) refers to the number of hours per week a student is expected to spend on preparation.

E) Maximum and Minimum Number of Subjects per Term

- Exchange students are required to choose a Host Pillar, with <u>at least 75%</u> of their total subject credits from their Host Pillar of choice.
- As the allocation of subject(s) is subjected to availability and fulfilment of the subject(s)' prerequisites, you may not be given your preferred choice of subjects to take during your
 exchange, hence you are required to select additional subjects in your order of preference
 when applying.
- Exchange students are eventually required to take a minimum of 24 subject credits (as required by Singapore Immigration in order to be issued with a Student Pass in Singapore) or a maximum of 48 subject credits in SUTD during your term of exchange.
- All subjects are taught in English.

UNDERTAKING RESEARCH DURING EXCHANGE AT SUTD

International Undergraduate Research Opportunities Programme (iUROP)

Research is integral to education at SUTD and SUTD undergraduates are exposed to research opportunities as part of the university's curriculum. To foster a spirit of learning and inquiry as part of the university's culture, exchange students are given the opportunity to participate in research through the International Undergraduate Research Opportunities Programme (iUROP) during their exchange period in SUTD.

Through iUROP, students get the opportunity to work together with faculty on cutting edge research projects and participate in the different phases of standard research activity which include, developing research plans, writing proposals, conducting research, analysing data and presenting research results in oral and written form. The practical skills and knowledge gained can eventually be applied to careers after graduation or as graduate students. In short, the iUROP experience helps to prepare the undergraduate researcher for the challenges of tomorrow.

Students will commit <u>no more than 12 hours per week</u> during regular term and no more than 35 hours per week during vacation period. The exact number of hours depends on the project nature, students' progress, students' arrangement with project supervisor as well as students' own time management. Upon completion of your iUROP project, your supervisor will recommend whether a iUROP certificate of participation will be awarded to you.

If you are interested to participate in iUROP during your exchange period, you may indicate your interest in your inbound exchange online application. Application for iUROP will be sent separately after the offer of student exchange.

C) Student Pass Application

Application through SOLAR system

All international students must hold a valid Student Pass issued by the Singapore Immigration & Checkpoints Authority (ICA) for their studies at SUTD. Generally, foreign students studying in SUTD are granted Student Pass for the full duration of the exchange period.

Application for Student Pass is to be made through the ICA Student's Pass On-Line Application & Registration (SOLAR) system. SUTD will inform you via email when the SOLAR system is open for application. You will need to login to SOLAR to complete the application, submit eForm16 and make payment of SGD30.00 for the non-refundable processing fee for Student Pass application.

• Issuance of In Principal Approval (IPA) Letter

At the end of your application, you should print out the electronic form eForm16 and bring it to Singapore, together with the In Principal Approval (IPA) Letter which will be emailed to you when your application is approved. For applicants who require a visa to enter Singapore, a visa will be incorporated in the IPA letter. Students need not apply for a separate visa and may enter Singapore by producing the IPA letter at the customs.

Making Appointment with ICA

Upon receipt of your IPA letter, you will be required to login to SOLAR system to make payment of SGD60.00 for issuance fee and SGD30.00 for multiple-journey visa (where applicable) and to make an appointment with ICA for completion of formalities for the issuance of your Student's Pass.

• Student Pass Collection Upon Arrival in Singapore

Upon arrival in Singapore, you will need to report to ICA on your appointment date for completion of formalities for the issuance of your Student's Pass. More information will be provided in the Admission Package emailed to you upon offer of exchange.

Cancellation / Returning of Student Pass

Foreign students are required to surrender their Student Passes for cancellation within 7 days from the date of cessation or termination of their study. SUTD will assist in the cancellation towards the end of your exchange and you will need to return your Student Pass to Office of International Relations / SUTD-ZJU Collaboration Office (Building 3 Level 3). You will receive a cancellation letter to be presented to the Immigration Office at the customs when you leave Singapore. Once the Student Pass has been cancelled, you will need to apply for the relevant pass/visa if you wish to re-enter Singapore

D) Student Insurance at SUTD

During your stay in SUTD (from Matriculation Day 6 September 2017 to end of Fall Term 16 December 2017), you will be covered by the SUTD Student Insurance Scheme (policy under AXA). Please refer to: http://www.mycg.com.sg/sutd (recommended to use Google Chrome for optimised viewing) for further details about your insurance such as insurance coverage, the list of AXA Panel GP Clinics you can visit if you feel unwell, and the procedures you need to complete if you require hospitalisation. Please make your own arrangement for travel insurance coverage should you intend to arrive in Singapore earlier than Matriculation Day 6 September 2017 or extend your stay in Singapore beyond the end of the Fall Term 16 December 2017.




