Courses conducted in English open for exchange students	<p>International Center Courses The curriculum of the International Center Courses focuses on Japan and East/Southeast Asia as a central theme. There are about 70 courses in various fields such as language and literature, arts, culture and cross-cultural understanding, science, religion and thought, history, media and communications, social issues, politics, diplomacy</p>

	<p>and international exchange, business and economy, and law.</p> <p>Keio Economics Professional Career Program (PCP)</p> <p>The Professional Career Program (PCP) is established within the Faculty of Economics. <p>Courses conducted in Japanese (Undergraduate Faculty Courses)</p>	<p>Students who have Japanese language proficiency equivalent to JLPT level N2 or above may take courses in Japanese offered by various Keio University undergraduate faculties.</p> <p>*Some registration restrictions and/or course prerequisites may apply. Physical education courses, foreign language courses, and courses in the School of Medicine are not open to exchange students.</p>
<p>Japanese language Courses</p>	<p>for Keio International Program (KIP) and Research Program:</p> <p>"Keio Japanese Courses" (a new Japanese language courses) will be offered by the Center for Japanese Studies from the 2016 Fall Semester. These courses include subjects in 7 study levels from elementary to advanced, in which students can effectively learn the Japanese language in a short period of time and balance their studies in Japanese language with other courses.</p> <p>The best feature of these courses is that the subjects are focused on developing skills of communication (speaking, listening, reading, and writing) comprehensively. At the elementary level, students can efficiently learn the basics of Japanese and cultivate the communication skills essential for daily life. In the intermediate and advanced levels, there are a variety of subjects offered to build up</p>

	<p>students' proficiency of language with mutual interaction in Japanese and to deepen their understanding of Japanese culture and society.</p> <p>for Japanese Language Program (JLP):</p> <p>JLP subjects are offered by the Center for Japanese Studies for students who would like to focus on Japanese language learning. Main Course, which is the core of the Japanese Language Program, is characterized by having a broad range of subject options. Students are able to choose any subject of their interest appropriate to their level from Japanese language subjects and other subjects related to Japanese culture.</p>

Additional information	<p>As a general rule, extending one's study period is not permitted. Please advise students to plan and choose their study period very carefully when applying.</p> <p>Keio University does not arrange early exams even for those who wish to leave early due to graduation or academic schedule conflicts.</p>

APPLICATION & SELECTION TIMELINE

Spring Admission	Fall Admission	Procedures
October 5	March 30	<u>Application deadline</u>
October - November	April - May	Screening of application documents by the Keio exchange student selection committee.
Mid-December	Mid-June	Once accepted, acceptance packages will be sent to the exchange coordinator by express mail.
Mid-December	Mid-June	Housing information will be sent by e-mail.

Mid-February	Late July	Keio will send accepted students the Certificate of Eligibility. With this certificate, students can apply for a student visa at the Japanese Embassy or consulate.
Late March *Usually around 23rd	Early September *Usually around 10th	Housing check-in
Late March	Mid-September	Orientation for exchange students

LIVING EXPENSES

Monthly living costs	Taking utilities, food, clothes, transportation, books and miscellaneous expenses into consideration, monthly living costs should come to about ¥130,000 - ¥170,000.
Example	Keio Housing*: ¥55,000 (room only) - ¥78,000 (breakfast and dinner inclusive for weekdays) *Utilities included Food: ¥30,000 - ¥60,000 Clothes: ¥10,000 - ¥20,000 Books: ¥7,000 Transportation: ¥8,000+ Medical Insurance: ¥1,500 Mobile Phone: ¥5,000+ Miscellaneous: ¥15,000
Important Notes:	It is important that students have enough funding to cover the expected costs of their stay at Keio, which should be at least ¥130,000 (or equivalent in their country's currency) per month for the expected period of stay. It is very difficult for exchange students to apply for a scholarship after they come to Japan. It is also difficult for exchange students to get a part-time job.

HOUSING

Availability of university dormitories	Keio housing (accommodations subsidized by Keio) is GUARANTEED for exchange students if they apply for housing on time.
Rent (subject to change)	The rent charged to students varies from ¥ 55,000 to ¥78,000 yen (approx. \$540 to \$760). Students will also be charged a one-time, additional maintenance fee of ¥20,000 for their first month's rent. Deposits and key money are not required.
Application procedures for housing	We will send housing information including the application procedures to students together with their acceptance letter.

Additional important information	No airport pick-up services are provided for students. Detailed directions will be given by e-mail after the student's dormitory is confirmed.
