Modular System	A programme leading to a 3 year Bachelor's degree requires a minimum of 120 MCs. As such, the usual load for NUS students is 16 to 20 modular credits (MCs) per semester, where 1 MC is equal to 2.5 hours of study and preparation per week. Minimum and maximum number of modules to be taken for each semester/year	Exchange students are required to read a minimum of 12 modular credits (MCs) per semester (approximately 3 modules) and no more than 20 MCs (approximately 5 modules), regardless of whether these modules are set to audit or examinable.
Are students allowed to take cross-faculty modules?	Yes, subject to fulfillment of pre-requisites, availability of the modules, as well as approval from home university.
Can students take modules of a different level, eg. students at Year 1 take Level 3 modules?	Yes, subject to: 1. Pre-requisites of the modules; 2. Availability of the modules; and 3. Approval by the respective NUS faculties/departments
