About the University	The University of Rhode Island (URI), chartered in 1888, began as the state agricultural school. Today, a land-and sea-grant public university, URI has grown into a major research institution, offering over 80 undergraduate majors to over 14,600 enrolled undergraduate students.

	Fields of particular strength at URI include marine affairs, business, and engineering.
	<u>Campus Facts & Figures:</u> URI's main campus - Kingston Campus- is located on a beautiful 1,200-acre rural property in the historic village of Kington, Rhode Island (pop. 23,000) in the southern part of the "Ocean State". The spacious campus includes a quadrangle of handsome old granite buildings surrounded by modern academic buildings and residence halls. The local area is rich in colonial history and the village of Kingston itself is a national historic monument.

	<u>Surrounding Area and Beyond:</u> URI is just 16 kilometers from the Atlantic Ocean and scenic beaches, which are ideal for swimming, sailing, and surfing.
	The location also allows easy access by train / bus to various destinations across the north-eastern United States, such as: - Providence (25 km) - Boston (121 km) - New York City (257 km)
Climate and Environs	The weather in Rhode Island is generally unpredictable – It is warm and sunny during the summer months, with temperatures ranging from 24-32 degrees Celsius.
	The weather is cold and gray during the winter months and often brings snow with it. The spring and autumn months are generally pleasant.
Public Transportation	Air : The closest domestic airport is T.F. Green Airport (Providence), just 20 km away. The closest international airport is Logan Airport (Boston), which is easily accessible by train.

Students may access the e-Campus system by going to the e-Campus webpage (<u>web.uri.edu/ecampus/</u>).
	The Office of International Education will provide each student with a URI Student Identification Number (within admission letter) and notify the student when it is possible to proceed with account activation and course registration.
	<u>Important Considerations</u> : Exchange students live on the Kingston (main) Campus. When enrolling in courses, students should be mindful of <u>which</u> URI campus each course is being offered at before enrollment.
	Enrollment in courses at the <u>Providence Campus</u> & <u>Narragansett Bay Campus</u> are possible, but require additional transportation, and special considerations and planning.
