## Requirements

Academic levels at which exchange students can take courses Undergraduate/Bachelor, Graduate/Master's, Postgraduate/PhD	Please see Bilateral Agreement
One semester work load equals 30 ECTS points (European Credit Transfer System)	Applicants have to qualify as full time students and sign up for 30 ECTS points per semester. The work load comprises of 50% courses & 50% project work
Language(s) of instruction for courses open to exchange students	Danish and English.
Language requirements	All students intending to take courses taught in English, have to provide results of their English test. The level of English required has to be equivalent to: IELTS: 6.5 or TOEFL paper-based: 550 or TOEFL computer based: 225 or TOEFL internet-based: 80 Applicants whose native language is English or applicants whose first university degree was obtained at a university where all lectures were in English do not need to provide results of their English test.
Other requirements for incoming exchange students(E.g. insurance, certain fees, visa)	All incoming exchange students with admission to Roskilde University are contacted personally (by e-mail) by the International Office and informed of the entry requirements.

## **Cost of living**



In terms of living expenses, it is difficult to predict how much money the student will need. To give a rough estimate of the average monthly expenses, here is an approximate budget:

Housing	DKK 3000-4000 (€ 400-535)
Food	DKK I500-2000 (€ 200-270)
Transportation	DKK 300-1100 (€ 40-150) – depending on whether you live on campus or in the city
Books	DKK 450-600 (€ 60-80)

The student should expect to spend an approximate total of DKK 8,000 per month, but it depends on one's personal standards and requirements.
