## Application and Registration Procedures

Application (www.lmu.de/international/incoming/application)

After completing the online application, you should sign, print out the form, have it signed by the relevant coordinator at the home university and then send it by post to the International Office at LMU.

Winter Semester: May 15 Summer Semester: November 15

Registration

Registration of new incoming LMUexchange students takes place in September/October and March/April respectively. You will be informed about registration dates in the official letter of acceptance (Zulassungsbescheid), which you will receive after the application deadline.

# Studying at LMU

### Course Information

Consult the online course catalogue at: <a href="https://www.lsf.lmu.de">www.lsf.lmu.de</a> (no login required, simply click on the link "Vorlesungsverzeichnis" to access the online course catalogue.)

The up-to-date course catalogue is available only two months before the beginning of each semester. Before the catalogue goes online students may consult the faculty websites where there is often general information about choosing courses etc.

As an exchange student you must choose at least 50% of your course modules in one department only. You should take the other 50% of your course modules in no more than two other departments (example: 50% of courses in the Department of German Philology, 25% of courses in the Department of History and 25% of courses in the Department of Politics).

If you have no previous knowledge and study experience in a subject area, you will solely be permitted to take introductory courses in this field. As a rule, bachelor students will not be permitted to take master courses (any exceptions to this rule will be discussed and decided by LMU).

Grading System (www.lmu.de/international/incoming/grading)

At LMU credit for Bachelor and Master Courses is given in accordance with the European Credit Transfer System (ECTS). All coursework will be graded in accordance with the German grading system ("1"-"6", with "1" being the best and "6" the worst grade). A course that is graded with 4 or above is passed. Some course are not graded (non-graded lectures).



# Language Requirements at LMU

In order to make the most of your experience in Munich and at LMU, it is important to have good German language skills. Although many departments offer modules taught in English, the language of instruction at LMU is generally German, particularly at bachelor level.

At the time of commencing your studies at LMU you are required to have at least CEFR level B2 in German, unless stated otherwise at the link below. The same proficiency level applies if you plan to take courses in English.

If you choose to take only courses taught in English, generally no German language skills are required. There are, however, exceptions to this rule. Further information: <a href="https://www.lmu.de/international/incoming/language">www.lmu.de/international/incoming/language</a>

# Language Preparation and Orientation


## Language Courses

#### Visa

If you require a visa, you are strongly recommended to send us your printed application form and supporting documents before the application deadlines for admission to the university.

## Insurance

Adequate health insurance is mandatory for all exchange students. We strongly recommend that you arrive with adequate travel insurance to cover you until you are officially registered as a student at LMU. You should then take out German health insurance cover for the duration of your stay at LMU. Be aware that insurance packages for study abroad in your home country may not fulfill the German requirements and will therefore not be accepted. Please note that travel insurance for the duration of your stay is not enough and will not be accepted at registration. Accident, personal and third party liability insurance for the duration of your stay in Germany is strongly recommended.
