Visa

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Accommodation

On-Campus residence	<p>Students apply for accommodation directly on the web page of the Central Accommodation Service. The International Office no longer deals with accommodation.</p> <p>Erasmus and Exchange students can make a request for accommodation in a CTU dormitory here: https://web.suz.cvut.cz/Login The username and password will be sent directly to students together with letter of acceptance.</p> <p>Accommodation guide is here: http://intranet.cvut.cz/incomers/erasmus-exchange/a</p> <p>Contact for questions regarding the accommodation: ubytovani@suz.cvut.cz</p>
Cost:	The overall rent for a shared room in a student dormitory is between about Euro 100 and Euro 155 per month including electricity, heating and water for a room shared with one other student.
Cost of Meal:	In the student canteens (menzas) a basic meal costs Euro 1,5 - 2. In modest restaurants outside the centre, a meal costs Euro 2 – 4. In the tourist and downtown areas, you can pay as much as you like.
Alternative accommodation:	A flat that 4 students can share costs about Euro 500 – 700 on the open market.

International Student Club

The International Student Club	<p>The prize-winning International Student Club at CTU in Prague offers a wide range of assistance to ensure that international students have the richest possible study and social experience in Prague. ISC 'buddies' contact incoming international students before their arrival, and offer to meet them at the airport/railway station, and then help them to settle in. Problem solving, excursions, parties and sports activities are only a part of the ISC programme during the semester.</p> <p>https://www.isc.cvut.cz</p>
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Health insurance

Health insurance regulations:	All students are required to have health insurance. Students not resident in EU/EFTA countries are required to have health insurance before they can pick up their visa. Students from EU countries need to have a "health insurance document for abroad (E128)" issued by a health insurance company in their home country.
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Employment

Employment opportunities for exchange students:	EU students are entitled to work in the same way as Czech students. However, opportunities are limited, and rates of pay are low. Non-EU students with a student visa are allowed to do paid work only if it is closely linked to their study programme.
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Language

Language certificate	A certificate of English language skills for Erasmus and Exchange students is required as an attachment to the application form. International Office requires a certified level of at least B2 according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages. http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Common_European_Framework_of_Reference_for_Languages Any equivalent certificate will be acceptable.
Czech language courses	One-year Czech language courses are offered, for example by UJOP, Charles University http://ujop.cuni.cz/en/courses/preparatory-courses-for-university-study LLP/Erasmus students are recommended to take the accredited Czech language courses offered at various levels by the International office of CTU in Prague.
Czech Life and Culture	The International Office at CTU in Prague offers an accredited course in Czech Life and Culture which is specially aimed at students spending their first semester as a visiting student at CTU in Prague.

Overview of average costs per month

A Czech student living in a university dormitory and eating in university canteens is able to live nicely on Euros 250 per month. This does not, however, include eating and drinking in the downtown tourist area.
