Program Overview

Classroom Study

Each course includes 16 hours of instruction, delivered in two-hour morning and afternoon class segments. The instructors will encourage and lead students through discussions of complex accounting and finance topics. Classes will culminate with a final exam. All classes will be in English. Certificates will be awarded upon successful completion of the program.

Cultural Visits

China Executive Leadership Programs staff will plan cultural events and accompany the group on field trips to famous modern and historical attractions in Chicago, St. Louis, and Springfield.

Supervised Group Out-of-State Travel

Following the end of the program, students will have a 7-day group trip with a chaperone from the China Executive Leadership Programs. Students will visit key tourist sites, world-class universities and government organizations in Chicago, Washington D.C. and New York City before departing for China.

The Courses

Financial Management



The financial management course is a sophisticated examination of global assets and their attendant risks. Topics covered will include, but are not limited to, the mathematics and risks associated with equities, bonds, mutual funds, real estate, insurance, derivatives, and commodities, as well as the mathematics of interest rates, financial functions, domestic and global income tax considerations, retire-

ment and health issues, and enterprise risk management.

Accounting Theory - Special Topics



This course introduces students to the role of accounting information as a tool used by decision makers for resource allocation and as a tool used by the firm internally to coordinate and control its broader organizational units. Within a small business context, students will develop a deeper appreciation for the qualities of useful information, the business environment in which financial report-

ing decisions are made, and the risks which threaten the achievement of organizational objectives.

Entrepreneurship



The goal of this course is to learn to use financial statements as tools to help manage a business, to learn some of the contemporary methods of financing small businesses, their attendant costs and benefits, to gain some understanding about the business environment and its effects on owner-managers of businesses, to gain an

understanding of the problems of start-up ventures, and to learn different approaches to the valuation of businesses. The student is expected to assume the role and attitude of the owner-manager of a business. The course is intended to help the owner-manager with planning, contracting, financing alternatives, and valuation.

Program Fees

Program Fee includes tuition, training materials, cultural activities, use of university facilities, and local transportation through the Champaign-Urbana mass transit bus system. *\$3000 per person*

Campus Meal Fee includes breakfast and dinner at Illinois Street Residence Hall. Other meals are at the participants' additional expense. *\$230 per person*

Cultural Travel Fee (optional) includes a 7-day group trip with a CELP chaperone. Students will visit key tourist sites in Chicago, Washington D.C. and New York City before departing for China. The travel fee does <u>not</u> include airfare, meals, or any other miscellaneous expenses (hotel tips, bus driver tips, souvenirs, etc.). **\$900 per person**

*Amount is with double occupancy room. Students also need to pay for their international round trip and domestic airfare, health insurance as required by the U.S. government, and any required textbooks.
